The annual announcement reflects a growth in "Best Nursing Homes," from 19 to 42 in Louisiana compared to 2013, a 121 percent increase.

U.S. News determines its annual rankings through data collected from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). The federal agency assigns each nursing center certified by the government a rating of one to five stars through its Five-Star Rating System. *U.S. News* names all those with a five-star rating a "Best Nursing Home."
